Pacific oyster (*Magallana gigas*) Length: up to 18 cm



Slipper limpet (*Crepidula fornicata*) Length: up to 5 cm



Orange-striped anemone (*Diadumene lineata*)
Size: up to 2 cm across



Carpet sea squirt (*Didemnum vexillum*) 2–5 mm thick, up to 1 m in length



Leathery sea squirt (Styela clava) Length: up to 12 cm



Compass sea squirt (Asterocarpa humilis) Length: up to 3.5 cm

Japanese skeleton shrimp (*Caprella mutica*) Size: males up to 3.5 cm



Chinese mitten crab (*Eriocheir sinensis*) Size: shell typically 8 cm across



Asian shore crab (*Hemigrapsus sanguineus*) Size: shell up to 4.2 cm across



Wakame (*Undaria pinnatifida*) Length: 1–3 m



Devil's tongue weed (*Grateloupia turuturu*) Length: up to 1 m



Bonnemaison's hook weed (*Bonnemaisonia hamifera*) Length: up to 20 cm

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
